Feelings

Read a different type of book you have not read before — funny, scary, comic, mystery. Did you enjoy it or not? Why?









Prediction

Before reading a new book, draw the front cover and write a prediction of what you think the book may be about. Explain why you think this.



Daily Reading

Read at least 4 pages of your book every day.



Book Review

Write a book review about a book you have read. What was your favourite part of the book and why? What is the story about? What age of child would it appeal to? How many stars out of 5 would you give it?

Character Description

Read a book of your choice and write a description of your favourite character. Describe their

appearance and personality.

Fact Finding

Read a non-fiction book and write down 10 facts you have learnt from it. Can you teach your teacher something new?

Summarising

Once you're finished reading a book, summarise in a few sentences the opening/middle/end of the story.

Re-telling

Read a book in bed and re-tell the story by drawing pictures only.



New Character

Create a new character for a book you are reading. Add labels to describe their appearance and personality.

Prediction Semi

Choose a new book to read. Before you read it, write down why you have chosen that book. What made you want to read it? What do you think the book will be about?

Improving Vocabulary

Pick 5 new words from a book you have read and find the meaning. Use these words in a sentence of your own.

Feelings

Find words in your book that the author has used to make you feel happy/ angry/ frightened/ worried/ nervous.

Can you find 10 adjectives in a book you have read? Can you use them in your own sentence?
